Who Likes Money?


The Annual Cash Bash is on sale right now.

SAVE THE DATES

There are 3 special events happening at The Arc within the next six weeks.

All will require on line registration. More details will be in the October newsletter. The only registration which is now open is a bus trip.

The Arc has not had a bus trip since 2019 due to COVID. This October, Saturday, October 21, The Arc will be taking a bus trip to Akron, Ohio, to the Akron Zoo. The bus and the zoo will be paid for by The Arc. It is one of the bonuses of being an Arc member. Only Arc members in good standing can register.

Following the zoo, The Arc will head 10 minutes up the road to Cuyahoga Valley National Park.

Did you know that there is not a national park within easy driving distance other than Cuyahoga Valley? That is right. Not in Pennsylvania, or New Jersey, Delaware, Maryland, New York, West Virginia, or other neighboring states. Only Ohio. If you have

not visited one of the only 63 National Park's you are in for a treat. This national treasure boasts waterfalls, stunning bridges over the river, and what should be gorgeous foliage in October. This unique experience will conclude with a meal at a restaurant not found in Pennsylvania.

The Arc requests that each Arc member be accompanied by a staff offering support (multiple people can be supported) or one parent. Bus cost &zoo admittance cost will be provided by The Arc. There will be a \$25 per person security deposit. Once you board the bus, you will receive your \$25 back. If you do not arrive by boarding time the deposit will be forfeited. Changes Have Arrived. All Reservations on-line only

The Arc of Blair County is changing how people are to register for classes. Beginning with the September classes, The Arc will no longer accept phone calls reserving a spot in a class. This is ONLY for classes which state 'reservations required' on the calendar. This is NOT for the regular classes or 'drop in' programs such as ukulele, drumming, or line dancing.

A new system, with simple steps, is being used through The Arc website self-registration.

The Arc hopes that by registering through the website that it will eliminate situations where people state they telephoned a reservation or informed a staff member yet no record exists of the reservation. Many situations occur where people arrive that were not accounted for when materials need to be purchased.

The new system will also alleviate the need to call three and four times to be certain a person is registered for a class. The new format will send an email confirming registration. If an email is not received, it indicates that an error occurred during input. Please go back in and try again until a confirmation email is received.

The new registration system will indicate how many spots remain in the class. For example, if a class size is limited to 10 people, it will indicate 2 of 10 spots remain. Once the class is full, it will not allow registrations to occur. This is your signal that the class is no longer available to attend.


Easy Instructions for Sign ups

Mandatory to reserve a spot in a class. Phone reservations no longer accepted. This only applies if the calendar states 'reservation required'. Regular weekly classes, such as line dancing, drumming, and ukulele do not require any reservation.

- 1. Go to www. Thearcblair.org
- 2. Then go to members—> sign up for Arc Classes —-> click the class you want to sign up for (The instructions on this page will use the woodworking class as our example)




3. You will come to this screen which shows the date of the event, the time and spots left.



4. Click the red sign up

- 5. Fill in the information below with name, email and phone number. It is very important that your email and phone number are correct!

7. YOU WILL GET A CONFIRMATION EMAIL! If you do not receive an email, something was missed. Please go back and retry each step. Please note: The form will 'log out' or 'time out' after a few minutes so be sure you have all the required information ready to type.
